# Letter to Your Principal: School Uniforms

## How Uniforms Prevent Bullying



### **Claim and Focus**

A claim is made ("I think school uniforms are a good idea"), but it is overly general and does not fully address the demands of the prompt. The essay loses focus ("The girls who get bullied...become sad and depressed") which makes it challenging for the reader to follow the claim at times.



### Support and Evidence

Some reasoning and evidence are presented ("In my school girls are mostly judging other girls about what they wear," "school uniforms cost less than a hundred for the school year"), but explanations of how they precisely support the claim are underdeveloped.



#### Organization

While distinct paragraphs are not evident, the format of a letter is recognizable as are basic elements of an introduction and conclusion. Some transitions are used ("But," "This causes," "Every year"), but connections between and among ideas are not consistently clear.



### Language and Style

A formal style and consistent perspective are not maintained as the essay shifts between first and third person throughout. Some stronger word choices are made ("eliminate," "depressed"), but the language generally does not show an awareness of the reader's interests.



#### Using Exemplars in Your Lessons

Exemplar essays are tools to take abstract descriptions and make them more concrete for students. One way to use them is to print the clean copies of the essays and allow students to use the rubric to make notes or even find examples of important elements of an essay - thesis statements, introductions, evidence, conclusions, transitions, etc. Teachers can also use exemplars to illustrate what each score point within a trait 'looks like' in an authentic student essay.
