A Proclamation About Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks Was a Hero



Clarity and Focus

While the essay may attempt to establish a central idea ("Rosa Parks was a hero"), it does not relate to the connection between Obama's statement and Parks' actions. The ideas presented are on topic but are not focused on addressing the demands of the prompt.



Development

Specific examples of Parks' actions are not provided. Shallow explanations of Obama's statement ("we have the right to stand up for ourselves and its wrong to treat others bad") and Parks' actions ("helping other people to stand up for equality") do not effectively develop a central idea, and the only cited text is from the prompt question.



Organization

The essay does not employ a basic organizational structure, and the lack of both paragraphs and transitions makes the ideas hard to follow. A clear introduction is not evident (the first sentence makes an attempt), and a conclusion is entirely missing.



Language and Style

The sentence structure throughout the essay is simplistic and repetitive. While some key words are present ("equality," "courage"), the language overall is general and sometimes improper ("its wrong to treat others bad"). A formal style is attempted but not maintained ("I know I wouldn't of moved either would you?").



Using Exemplars in Your Lessons

Exemplar essays are tools to take abstract descriptions and make them more concrete for students. One way to use them is to print the clean copies of the essays and allow students to use the rubric to make notes or even find examples of important elements of an essay - thesis statements, introductions, evidence, conclusions, transitions, etc. Teachers can also use exemplars to illustrate what each score point within a trait 'looks like' in an authentic student essay.
