

Being Different



Plot and Ideas

The exposition does not support the development of the plot. A central idea is not established, also impeding any development toward the climax or resolution. Additionally, the plot and ideas do not stay focused on addressing the demands of the task.



Development and Elaboration

The narrative does not have a clear, established setting. Characters are introduced ("My older brothers call me a nerd and other names"), but they are not adequately developed. Minimal dialogue is included ("Why don't you like sports").



Organization and Sequencing

The narrative does not contain a sequence of events with a definite beginning, middle, and end. Few transitions are used to show connections between ideas or shifts in the setting. The writer attempts to create a resolution ("So, when my family is watching sports I feel different because I don't have any interest in doing that"), but it does not give closure to the story.



Language and Style

Descriptive words are not used throughout this narrative. Sentences lack variety ("Sometimes they make fun of me and it feels bad and it hurts my feelings"), and the writing is not engaging. A lack of descriptive vocabulary and unique voice do not engage the reader.



Using Exemplars in Your Lessons

Exemplar essays are tools to take abstract descriptions and make them more concrete for students. One way to use them is to print the clean copies of the essays and allow students to use the rubric to make notes or even find examples of important elements of an essay - thesis statements, introductions, evidence, conclusions, transitions, etc. Teachers can also use exemplars to illustrate what each score point within a trait 'looks like' in an authentic student essay.
